Senior organisation involved in the World Badminton Championships

- BWF WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS 2023
- AUGUST, 21.-27. AT THE ROYAL ARENA (COPENHAGEN, DENMARK)

LEGACY OBJECTIVE:

In connection with the World Badminton Championships, the City of Copenhagen, DGI Copenhagen and Badminton Denmark had a goal of promoting badminton for individuals aged 60 and above because of the numerous physical and mental health benefits associated with racket sports (Pekka Oja et al BJSM, June 2017). Benefits which would have a positive effect on each senior player, the City of Copenhagen, and society as a whole.

To support this effort, Copenhagen Legacy Lab (Wonderful Copenhagen) decided to facilitate creative workshop as part of a legacy process in collaboration with Danske Seniorer (Danish Seniors), Badminton Denmark, and DGI Copenhagen. The purpose was to establish new interdisciplinary collaborations among the partners and determine how senior members of Danske Seniorer could be actively involved before, during, and after the World Badminton Championships.

ACTIVITIES:

Activity 1: Senior volunterism

A volunteer program for seniors was established to create new social communities for seniors during the tournament.

Prior to the World Badminton Championships, Danske Seniorer informed their members nationwide about the opportunities to volunteer during the event. The members could register individually or sign up as a group through their local branch. Badminton, Denmark and DGI Copenhagen secured that the volunteer programs were outlined according to a senior lifestyle, considering factors such as physical exertion, task content, and working hours.

Activity 2: Promote senior badminton

The idea was to host a pre-event for seniors one week before the World Badminton Championships. The event was intended to focus on health, exercise, and social interaction, with the participation of politicians and celebrities interested in badminton. Unfortunately, this event was not realized.

Instead, Danske Seniorer plans to promote senior badminton after the World Badminton Championships in collaboration with DGI Copenhagen, who can provide support, training materials, and club contacts.

EVALUATION:

Activity 1: Senior volunteerism

The result was that around 30 members of Danske Seniorer assisted as volunteers during the World Badminton Championships.

After the tournament, Copenhagen Legacy Lab and Danske Seniorer conducted a smaller study to assess the volunteers' experiences. More than half of the volunteers from Danske Seniorer was included in the study which suggests that:

- Nine out of ten respondents had a good or very good experience.
- Three out of four respondents agreed or strongly agreed that it was a fun experience and that they felt part of a social community. The rest were neutral.
- All respondents found it likely or very likely that they would volunteer again in the future.

Activity 2: Promote senior badminton

After the event, the new relationships between involved organizations and association have opened new opportunities to promoting senior badminton and clubs around Copenhagen by sharing information through Danske Seniorer's electronic newsletter.

The goal of generating greater interest in senior badminton, becoming part of a community, and benefiting from physical activity will be fully evaluated once the 2023 World Badminton Championships are further in the past.
